Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa claimant funding

Purpose

- This memorandum seeks your approval to the release of \$50,000 of claimant funding to Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa from their staimant funding allocation. The proposed release would allow Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa to progress the governance entity and relification milestones.
- 2. Cabinet enthorised the Secretary for Justice to release claimant funding within the amounts set aside for each milestone from the overall claimant funding amount prow Min (09) 6/4 and CAB Min (09) 20/2 refer].

Background

- ha vine 2009, Cabinet approved further modifications to the claimant funding policy [CAB Min (09) 20/2 refers]. The Minister for Treaty of Waitangi Negotiations and the Minister of Finance subsequently agreed that Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa receive an allocation of \$1,009,000 of claimant funding as a contribution to expenses incurred in negotiating their deed of mandate, terms of negotiation, agreement in principle, doed of settlement, ratification, legislation and governance workstreams.
- 4. The proposed release is within your delegated financial authority as Deputy Secretary Treaty and Director. The proposed release is appropriated through the non-departmental other expense appropriation: Claimant Funding. There is sufficient funding for the proposed release.

Claimant funding request

 Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa have requested the release of \$50,000 of claimant funding. Officials are satisfied that the information they have provided shows they have incurred \$54,607.62 of legitimate negotiation costs against the previous release of \$50,000.

Progress in negotiations

Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa signed an agreement in principle with the Crown on 22 December 2007.

- 8. At Mr McKenzie's instigation the Trust Board set up a working group to focus on development of a PSGE. Attached is a power point presentation prepared earlier this year by the working group.
- 9. Withheld under section 9(2)(g)(i) of the Official Information Act 1982
- 10. There is now a new Trust Board chairman, David Manuel, who for some time has been a marge representative to the Trust Board. Mr McKenzie remains on the board as a representative of his marge. Mr Manuel and indeed the Trust Board as a whole want to continue PSGE development. However they require a new claimant funding tranche for this to occur.
- 11. Withheld under section 9(2)(g)(i) of the Official Information Act 1982.

Remaining claimant funding

- 12. If you approve the claimant funding request, \$14,000 funding for the legislation and governance milestone will remain and \$114,000 will remain available to Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa for the ratification milestone.
- A total of \$456,000 of claimant funding will remain to enable Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa to complete the settlement process.

the proposed release is within your financial delegation, and there is adequate funding under the Non-departmental Other Expense appropriation: Claimant Funding in 2012/13;

 approve the release of \$50,000 of claimant funding to Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa (\$20,000 from their legislation and governance claimant funding milestone and \$30,000 from their ratification claimant funding milestone); and



 note that if you approve this recommendation, Ngatikahu ki Whangaroa will have \$14,000 from their legislation and governance milestone and \$114,000 from their ratification milestone unspent.



The signed Agreement in Principal (AIP) - 2

Obligations prior to transfer

- Crown must maintain the Stony Creek Assets at the time of transfer and commercial arrangements are signed
- The Crown must maintain Stong Creek Station Stock at the time of transfer and commercial arrangements are signed
- This means that Stony Creek assets & stock will be returned in a commercially viable and sustainable condition ready and able for business

Conditions of transfer

- In the very unlikely event that assets (Stony Creek Station; The Clark Block; The Thompson Block) returned are sold within 30 years after settlement date then 50% of all sales proceeds (excluding sales expenses) must be paid to the Crown




